

### A Message from Jon Davidann: How Being Up in the Air Changed My Life

I have spent 28 years at HPU shaping young minds into budding historians who understand the importance of historical perspective, which is when we look to the past to help explain the present. My students also learn to use context historically and in their own lives in today's world. These two ways of thinking allow them to thrive in a transforming world where much that we assumed is true seems adrift.

It is my firm belief that as we enter a more uncertain age, storytelling will assume greater importance in the world's twenty-first-century societies. I have a personal story I'd like to share with you.

One day, I was twenty feet up in the air, covered in paint, exhausted, wondering how I got myself into this mess. Standing on a ladder with a brush in hand, I started thinking about what to do with a house I owned in Kailua, Hawai'i, that I was repainting. I could sell it, but the capital gains tax was daunting. I could do a 721 exchange or a 1031 exchange, but neither appealed to me.




#### Jesse Nakanishi - Men's Basketball Coach



### HPU Awarded First-in-Hawai'i NSF Grant for Coastal Research

HPU has received a \$502,819 grant from the National Science Foundation's Building Research Capacity of New Faculty in Biology program to study sea-level rise and methane in coastal wetlands. # HPU Alumnus Anthony Katz '03 The Accidental Entrepreneur



When HPU alumnus Anthony Katz '03 turned 30 he had a vision for the nascent industry of sports recovery. One morning, he got in his car and drove to a wetsuit factory in Southern California with a pair of scissors, cutting neoprene into shapes that could fit around his knee.

Katz was not starting a business, yet. He was just trying to keep up his basketball pickup games without feeling wrecked the next day.

"I made my prototype with the neoprene and wore it after basketball games at UC Irvine. One day, a friend asked me, 'Where'd you get that? I just made it, I said." And that's the moment when it clicked, Katz remembered, still a little surprised at his discovery more than a decade later.

That homemade ice wrap, part wetsuit sleeve, part medical bag, became the spark of **Hyperice**, Katz's company now valued in the hundreds of millions and used by everyone from Kobe Bryant to Olympic skiers. In fact, Bryant became the first recipient of the Hyperice knee ice and compression wrap!

But Katz will be the first to tell you the truth: he wasn't sure what he was making at the time, only that it would be the start of an incredible story. Katz grew up with his mother and father in the small town of Laguna Niguel, California, in the 80s and 90s, what he affectionally calls "predigital childhood."

"We were the first generation with a computer in the house, but I didn't get on the internet until my second year of college," he said. "The social dynamic was different back then. We didn't have digital identities. That came later, when we were all adults."

Katz was raised in a middle-class home where college was non-negotiable. Sports, movies, and hip hop soundtracked his youth, but academics? Not early on. Not yet.
