[#]If PSY 4925 is taken for the capstone, PSY 3925 must be taken in a preceding semester. 4950 is only offered in Fall and 4900 is only offered in 8 week terms. *If students chose PSY 4950 they will have met the UDV requirement and will have an elective here; otherwise take any UDV course. [†]Courses in red are only offered once per year in 16 week terms. They are often available in the opposing term as 8 week courses.

Sequencing rules: PSY 2100 requires PSY 1000 and either PSY 1100 or MATH 1123; PSY 2200 requires PSY 2100 and WC&IL 2. Most core courses (3x00=3100, 3200 etc.) require both PSY 2100 and 2200. Capstone courses (49xx) require completion of three of the core courses.
